To any Sheriff, Policeman, or Law Enforcement Officer in the County of Tulsa, Oklahoma: Probable cause having been shown on this date before me by **Corporal M. Griffin** for believing the following described property and certain controlled dangerous substances listed in the Schedules of the Controlled Dangerous Substances Act of the State of Oklahoma, to wit:

COCAINE, FRUITS, INSTRUMENTALITIES, AND OTHER CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES

listed in the schedules of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substance Act of the State of Oklahoma, with the unlawful intent to possess, use and distribute said substances in violation of the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Further, your affiant prays that the Court will grant law enforcement officers conducting the service of this search warrant permission to seize other items commonly used to facilitate the use and distribution of controlled substances, to wit:

AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

The undersigned affiant, being first duly sworn, upon oath says: that in TULSA County, Oklahoma, at and upon or within a certain vehicle, house, building, premises, or persons, the curtilage thereof and the appurtenances thereto belonging, described as follows:

BLACK NYLON DUFFEL BAG MARKED "OUTDOOR PRODUCTS USA"

The named defendant, or other persons in whose possession he has placed the following described property for concealment, does now unlawfully, illegally, knowingly and willfully keep, and does unlawfully have in possession and under his control certain dangerous substances, to wit:

COCAINE, FRUITS, INSTRUMENTALITIES, AND OTHER CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES

listed in the schedules of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substance Act of the State of Oklahoma, with the unlawful intent to possess, use and distribute said substances in violation of the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Further, your affiant prays that the Court will grant law enforcement officers conducting the service of this search warrant permission to seize other items commonly used to facilitate the use and distribution of controlled substances, to wit:

MONIES OR UNEXPLAINED WEALTH, RECORDS AND FINANCIAL RECORDS IN PHYSICAL, DIGITAL, OR ELECTRONIC FORM, PROOF OF RESIDENCY, CELLULAR PHONES, PAGERS, KEYS, SAFES, SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT, AND FIREARMS

Your affiant states that said dangerous substances by reason of their physical structure are easily destroyed, and that there is likelihood that the person in possession of the same will attempt to destroy them. Your affiant further states that there is further likelihood that the foresaid controlled dangerous substance, equipment, and paraphernalia will be moved unless a search warrant may be executed in the day.

YOUR AFFIANT FURTHER STATES:

He is a police officer for the Tulsa Police Department and has been so employed for approximately eleven (11) years. On November 20, 2003, he was promoted to the rank of Corporal. He is presently assigned to a Special Investigations Division Narcotics Unit. He was employed as a Special Agent for the Department of Treasury, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms for approximately one (1) year. During that employment, he graduated from the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center's Criminal Investigator academy. He was also the Honor Graduate of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms New Professional Training academy held at the ATF National Academy. He has completed the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigations Clandestine Laboratory Basic Safety Certification and Clandestine Laboratory Site Safety Officer courses presented by Network Environmental Systems (NES). He has also taken part in experiments supervised by NES and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) during which he took part in the manufacturing process of methamphetamine on eight (8) separate occasions. He has attended the Association of Oklahoma Narcotics Enforcement school and has completed said course. He has completed the DEA Basic Narcotics Investigator School. He has graduated from the University of Tulsa with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He has received formal training in narcotics investigations from the Tulsa Police Academy as well as informal training received from more experienced officers. He has conducted numerous investigations involving the illegal distribution of controlled dangerous substances.

On September 22, 2009, Tulsa Police Officer Travis Ludwig was placed on restricted duty by order of Tulsa Police Chief Ronald Palmer. Because of this, Sergeant S. Tuell and Sergeant L. Young contacted Officer Ludwig in order to take custody of his Tulsa Police marked patrol unit, a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria, unit number P5039, bearing Oklahoma tag 3 59096 and VIN number 2FAFP71W15X117909.

When Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young informed Officer Ludwig of his restricted duty and their need to take custody of his marked patrol unit, Officer Ludwig asked to remove his personal property from the vehicle. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young agreed to allow him to do so and watched as this activity was completed. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young observed Officer Ludwig remove a firearm bag containing an AR-15 rifle

in it from the vehicle. They also observed as he removed a black and yellow Stanley Value Pack toolbox from the vehicle as well as a black nylon duffel bag marked "Outdoor Products USA". Officer Ludwig took the black nylon bag to the area of the front driver's seat, where he opened the driver's side door just enough to place his body and the bag in between the vehicle's body and the door. Officer Ludwig appeared to use his body to block the view of Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young while he made quick, furtive movements with his hands removing items from the door pocket as well as from the center console area and placed those items into the black nylon bag marked "Outdoor Products USA". Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young observed Officer Ludwig place the black nylon duffel bag, black and yellow toolbox, and the firearm bag containing the AR-15 rifle into Corporal A. Tallman's vehicle.

When Officer Ludwig informed Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young he had removed his personal items from the vehicle, they took possession of the vehicle. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young took possession of Tulsa Police Department marked unit P5039 and removed it to a facility where an administrative inventory of the vehicle could be completed. During an inventory of the vehicle, Sergeant Tuell observed a yellow capsule in the door pocket. Sergeant Young also discovered a small plastic bag containing a tannish-white, soft, chunky substance in the center console.

Upon discovering these items in marked unit P5039, Sergeant Tuell contacted Corporal Tallman regarding the duffel bag, toolbox, and firearm bag Officer Ludwig had placed into his vehicle. Corporal Tallman stated the bags and toolbox were still in his vehicle where Officer Ludwig had left them, and that no one had tampered with them or disturbed them in any way. Corporal Tallman also stated that Officer Ludwig had not had access to them since they had been placed in Corporal Tallman's vehicle. Corporal Tallman then turned those bags over to the custody of Sergeant Young. Sergeant Young transported those items to a police facility where he and Sergeant Tuell maintained their custody.

Your affiant and Captain N. Hondros met Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young at a police facility where they were in possession of Tulsa Police marked unit P5039 as well as the black duffel bag marked "Outdoor Products USA", the firearm bag containing an AR-15 rifle, and the black and yellow toolbox. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young explained the facts stated above to your affiant. Sergeant Tuell also showed your affiant the yellow capsule and small plastic bag containing a tannish-white, soft, chunky substance. At that time, your affiant observed the yellow capsule to be located on the driver's door armrest where the electric window controls are located. The small plastic bag containing the tannish-white, soft, chunky substance was still located in the center console.

Captain Hondros contacted K-9 Officer Wamsley and asked him to come to the scene to check if his K-9 partner would indicate on Tulsa Police marked unit P5039 as well as to see if his K-9 partner would indicate on any of the bags/toolbox Officer Ludwig had removed from the vehicle. Officer Wamsley has been a narcotic detector K-9 handler since October of 2000. In July of 2009, Officer Wamsley assumed the responsibility of being a handler of a narcotic detector dog (K-9) who was given the name "BUSTER". Officer Wamsley's responsibilities consist of the care, maintenance, training, and handling of BUSTER. BUSTER is a Belgian Malinois born in 2007 and imported for the sole purpose of narcotic detection. Officer Wamsley & BUSTER are certified by the Council of Law Enforcement Education & Training as a narcotic detector K-9 team, and hold license #K9-09-2162. Officer Wamsley continues to work on a regular basis with his K-9, consistently and systematically verifying his K-9's abilities to detect controlled and dangerous drugs.

Officer Wamsley conducted an open air sniff around and inside Tulsa Police marked unit P5039. During the open air search around the outside of the vehicle, BUSTER positively indicated on the outside of both front doors of the vehicle. BUSTER was then deployed inside the vehicle, where he positively indicated on the center console area.

Officer Wamsley conducted a field-test on the tannish-white, soft, chunky substance found in Tulsa Police Department marked unit P5039. The result of that field-test was POSITIVE for cocaine.

The yellow capsule and the plastic bag containing a tannish-white, soft, chunky substance were left inside Tulsa Police marked unit P5039.

Officer Wamsley conducted another open air sniff around the bags and toolbox Officer Ludwig had removed from Tulsa Police marked unit P5039. Prior to doing this, Officer Wamsley placed Officer Ludwig's bags and toolbox in line with three (3) "blanks" acquired from your affiant. "Blanks" are items known not to have been in contact with controlled dangerous substances. During the open air search around the outside of these bags, toolboxes and "blank" bags, BUSTER positively indicated on both Officer Ludwig's black nylon duffel bag marked "Outdoor Products USA" as well as his black and yellow Stanley Value Pack toolbox.

Tulsa Police marked unit P5039 as well as the black nylon duffel bag, firearm bag containing an AR-15, and the yellow and black toolbox remained in the custody of Sergeant Tuell after he took custody of them until he turned them over to Officer A. Kite. No one, including police personnel, has tampered with or in any way altered those items at any time.

Due to the facts stated above, Tulsa Police Corporal M. Helton and Officer B. Jackson went to Officer Ludwig's residence, 2113 West Oak Street, Collinsville, OK to secure it so that a search warrant could be completed at that location. During the time those officers have been conducting visual surveillance at that

residence, they have not observed anyone enter or exit the residence.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience on controlled dangerous substance investigations, individuals who use and sell controlled dangerous substances often house additional quantities of illegal substances at their residences or in their vehicles to avoid detection by Law Enforcement. These same individuals often keep weapons and firearms to use for protection, paraphernalia, instrumentalities used in the sale of controlled dangerous substances, monies or unexplained wealth, records and financial records in reference to their drug transactions in physical, digital, or electronic form, lists of buyers and sellers names, computers and electronic devices, associated hardware, software, diskettes, compact disks, and other electronic storage media to record their transactions.

Viewing and retrieving the contents and data of the computers and electronic devices, associated hardware, software, diskettes, compact disks, and other electronic storage media would be useful to show that controlled dangerous substances were unlawfully kept with the intent to use, possess, sale and/or distribute.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience, he knows that cellular phones are used by individuals who are involved in the use and/or distribution of controlled dangerous substances to coordinate the sale, transportation, and delivery of controlled dangerous substances. The communications consist of verbal communications or text messages transmitted through the phone. Further, it is common that persons who use cellular phones store the name and number of the persons they communicate with as electronic data in the form of names and phone numbers. Further, many phones are designed to store a record of recently called numbers, recently transmitted text messages, and to electronically store video and photos. Further, some cellular phone users assign photos, songs, or lyrics to frequent callers to identify the caller when a communication is received.





When Officer Ludwig informed Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young he had removed his personal items from the vehicle, they took possession of the vehicle. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young took possession of Tulsa Police Department marked unit P5039 and removed it to a facility where an administrative inventory of the vehicle could be completed. During an inventory of the vehicle, Sergeant Tuell observed a yellow capsule in the door pocket. Sergeant Young also discovered a small plastic bag containing a tannish-white, soft, chunky substance in the center console.

Upon discovering these items in marked unit P5039, Sergeant Tuell contacted Corporal Tallman regarding the duffel bag, toolbox, and firearm bag Officer Ludwig had placed into his vehicle. Corporal Tallman stated the bags and toolbox were still in his vehicle where Officer Ludwig had left them, and that no one had tampered with them or disturbed them in any way. Corporal Tallman also stated that Officer Ludwig had not had access to them since they had been placed in Corporal Tallman's vehicle. Corporal Tallman then turned those bags over to the custody of Sergeant Young. Sergeant Young transported those items to a police facility where he and Sergeant Tuell maintained their custody.

Your affiant and Captain N. Hondros met Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young at a police facility where they were in possession of Tulsa Police marked unit P5039 as well as the black duffel bag marked "Outdoor Products USA", the firearm bag containing an AR-15 rifle, and the black and yellow toolbox. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young explained the facts stated above to your affiant. Sergeant Tuell also showed your affiant the yellow capsule and small plastic bag containing a tannish-white, soft, chunky substance. At that time, your affiant observed the yellow capsule to be located on the driver's door armrest where the electric window controls are located. The small plastic bag containing the tannish-white, soft, chunky substance was still located in the center console.

Captain Hondros contacted K-9 Officer Wamsley and asked him to come to the scene to check if his K-9 partner would indicate on Tulsa Police marked unit P5039 as well as to see if his K-9 partner would indicate on any of the bags/toolbox Officer Ludwig had removed from the vehicle. Officer Wamsley has been a narcotic detector K-9 handler since October of 2000. In July of 2009, Officer Wamsley assumed the responsibility of being a handler of a narcotic detector dog (K-9) who was given the name "BUSTER". Officer Wamsley's responsibilities consist of the care, maintenance, training, and handling of BUSTER. BUSTER is a Belgian Malinois born in 2007 and imported for the sole purpose of narcotic detection. Officer Wamsley & BUSTER are certified by the Council of Law Enforcement Education & Training as a narcotic detector K-9 team, and hold license #K9-09-2162. Officer Wamsley continues to work on a regular basis with his K-9, consistently and systematically verifying his K-9's abilities to detect controlled and dangerous drugs.

Officer Wamsley conducted an open air sniff around and inside Tulsa Police marked unit P5039. During the open air search around the outside of the vehicle, BUSTER positively indicated on the outside of both front doors of the vehicle. BUSTER was then deployed inside the vehicle, where he positively indicated on the center console area.

Officer Wamsley conducted a field-test on the tannish-white, soft, chunky substance found in Tulsa Police Department marked unit P5039. The result of that field-test was POSITIVE for cocaine.

The yellow capsule and the plastic bag containing a tannish-white, soft, chunky substance were left inside Tulsa Police marked unit P5039.

Officer Wamsley conducted another open air sniff around the bags and toolbox Officer Ludwig had removed from Tulsa Police marked unit P5039. Prior to doing this, Officer Wamsley placed Officer Ludwig's bags and toolbox in line with three (3) "blanks" acquired from your affiant. "Blanks" are items known not to have been in contact with controlled dangerous substances. During the open air search around the outside of these bags, toolboxes and "blank" bags, BUSTER positively indicated on both Officer Ludwig's black nylon duffel bag

marked "Outdoor Products USA" as well as his black and yellow Stanley Value Pack toolbox.

Tulsa Police marked unit P5039 as well as the black nylon duffel bag, firearm bag containing an AR-15, and the yellow and black toolbox remained in the custody of Sergeant Tuell after he took custody of them until he turned them over to Officer A. Kite. No one, including police personnel, has tampered with or in any way altered those items at any time.

Due to the facts stated above, Tulsa Police Corporal M. Helton and Officer B. Jackson went to Officer Ludwig's residence, 2113 West Oak Street, Collinsville, OK to secure it so that a search warrant could be completed at that location. During the time those officers have been conducting visual surveillance at that residence, they have not observed anyone enter or exit the residence.

Based on your affiant's training and experience, he knows that individuals who are involved in the possession and/or distribution of controlled dangerous substances often keep and/or conceal controlled dangerous substances at their residence. This knowledge, along with the fact that cocaine was found inside Officer Ludwig's patrol unit, and the positive K-9 indication on his duffel bag and his toolbox, lead your affiant to believe additional evidence is more likely than not located at Officer Ludwig's residence as well.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience on controlled dangerous substance investigations, individuals who use and sell controlled dangerous substances often house additional quantities of illegal substances at their residences to avoid detection by Law Enforcement. These same individuals often keep weapons and firearms to use for protection, paraphernalia, instrumentalities used in the sale of controlled dangerous substances, monies or unexplained wealth, records and financial records in reference to their drug transactions in physical, digital, or electronic form, lists of buyers and sellers names, computers and electronic devices, associated hardware, software, diskettes, compact disks, and other electronic storage media to record their transactions.

Viewing and retrieving the contents and data of the computers and electronic devices, associated hardware, software, diskettes, compact disks, and other electronic storage media would be useful to show that controlled dangerous substances were unlawfully kept with the intent to use, possess, sale and/or distribute.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience, he knows that cellular phones are used by individuals who are involved in the use and/or distribution of controlled dangerous substances to coordinate the sale, transportation, and delivery of controlled dangerous substances. The communications consist of verbal communications or text messages transmitted through the phone. Further, it is common that persons who use cellular phones store the name and number of the persons they communicate with as electronic data in the form of names and phone numbers. Further, many phones are designed to store a record of recently called numbers, recently transmitted text messages, and to electronically store video and photos. Further, some cellular phone users assign photos, songs, or lyrics to frequent callers to identify the caller when a communication is received.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience on controlled dangerous substance investigations, individuals who commonly use and or sell quantities of controlled dangerous substances have visitors, friends and customers who visit their residence. Your affiant states that these types of individuals commonly place quantities of currency with which to purchase the controlled dangerous substances on their person. Your affiant states that these types of individuals also commonly purchase quantities of controlled dangerous substances and conceal the purchased quantities and associated drug paraphernalia on their person, in their clothing and personal effects as well as their vehicles.

Your affiant states that it is common for individuals that use and/or distribute controlled dangerous substances to do so from their residence, as well as keep additional quantities on hand for personal use and resale. Your affiant requests the issuance of a search warrant for the residence to be searched, 2113 West Oak Street, Collinsville, OK.

FURTHER YOUR AFFIANT SAYETH NOT.

WHEREFORE, Affiant asks that a search warrant be issued according to law, directed to any sheriff, policeman or law enforcement officer in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, commanding that he search said persons, premises and/or vehicle, and take possession of all the controlled dangerous substances, equipment and paraphernalia hereinbefore described, and vehicle in which said dangerous substance is unlawfully kept, deposited or concealed.



AFFIDAVIT FOR SEARCH WARRANT

The undersigned affiant, being first duly sworn, upon oath says: that in TULSA County, Oklahoma, at and upon or within a certain vehicle, house, building, premises, or persons, the curtilage thereof and the appurtenances thereto belonging, described as follows:

2005 FORD CROWN VICTORIA, TULSA POLICE MARKED PATROL UNIT P5039, BEARING OKLAHOMA TAG 3 59096, AND VIN 2FAFP71W15X117909

The named defendant, or other persons in whose possession he has placed the following described property for concealment, does now unlawfully, illegally, knowingly and willfully keep, and does unlawfully have in his possession and under his control certain dangerous substances, to wit:

COCAINE, FRUITS, INSTRUMENTALITIES, AND OTHER CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES

listed in the schedules of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substance Act of the State of Oklahoma, with the intent to possess, use and distribute said substances in violation of the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

Further, your affiant prays that the Court will grant law enforcement officers conducting the service of this search warrant permission to seize other items commonly used to facilitate the use and distribution of controlled substances, to wit:

MONIES OR UNEXPLAINED WEALTH, RECORDS AND FINANCIAL RECORDS IN PHYSICAL, DIGITAL, OR ELECTRONIC FORM, PROOF OF RESIDENCY, CELLULAR PHONES, PAGERS, KEYS, SAFES, SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT, AND FIREARMS

Your affiant states that said dangerous substances by reason of their physical structure are easily destroyed, and that there is likelihood that the person in possession of the same will attempt to destroy them. Your affiant further states that there is further likelihood that the foresaid controlled dangerous substance, equipment, and paraphernalia will be moved unless a search warrant may be executed in the day.

YOUR AFFIANT FURTHER STATES:

He is a police officer for the Tulsa Police Department and has been so employed for approximately eleven (11) years. On November 20, 2003, he was promoted to the rank of Corporal. He is presently assigned to a Special Investigations Division Narcotics Unit. He was employed as a Special Agent for the Department of Treasury, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms for approximately one (1) year. During that employment, he graduated from the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center's Criminal Investigator academy. He was also the Honor Graduate of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms New Professional Training academy held at the ATF National Academy. He has completed the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigations Clandestine Laboratory Basic Safety Certification and Clandestine Laboratory Site Safety Officer courses presented by Network Environmental Systems (NES). He has also taken part in experiments supervised by NES and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) during which he took part in the manufacturing process of methamphetamine on eight (8) separate occasions. He has attended the Association of Oklahoma Narcotics Enforcement school and has completed said course. He has completed the DEA Basic Narcotics Investigator School. He has graduated from the University of Tulsa with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He has received formal training in narcotics investigations from the Tulsa Police Academy as well as informal training received from more experienced officers. He has conducted numerous investigations involving the illegal distribution of controlled dangerous substances.

On September 22, 2009, Tulsa Police Officer Travis Ludwig was placed on restricted duty by order of Tulsa Police Chief Ronald Palmer. Because of this, Sergeant S. Tuell and Sergeant L. Young contacted Officer Ludwig in order to take custody of his Tulsa Police marked patrol unit, a 2005 Ford Crown Victoria, unit number P5039, bearing Oklahoma tag 3 59096 and VIN number 2FAFP71W15X117909.

When Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young informed Officer Ludwig of his restricted duty and their need to take custody of his marked patrol unit, Officer Ludwig asked to remove his personal property from the vehicle. Sergeant Tuell and Sergeant Young agreed to allow him to do so and watched as this activity was completed.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience on controlled dangerous substance investigations, individuals who use and sell controlled dangerous substances often house additional quantities of illegal substances at their residences or in their vehicles to avoid detection by Law Enforcement. These same individuals often keep weapons and firearms to use for protection, paraphernalia, instrumentalities used in the sale of controlled dangerous substances, monies or unexplained wealth, records and financial records in reference to their drug transactions in physical, digital, or electronic form, lists of buyers and sellers names, computers and electronic devices, associated hardware, software, diskettes, compact disks, and other electronic storage media to record their transactions.

Viewing and retrieving the contents and data of the computers and electronic devices, associated hardware, software, diskettes, compact disks, and other electronic storage media would be useful to show that controlled dangerous substances were unlawfully kept with the intent to use, possess, sale and/or distribute.

Based on your affiant's prior training and experience, he knows that cellular phones are used by individuals who are involved in the use and/or distribution of controlled dangerous substances to coordinate the sale, transportation, and delivery of controlled dangerous substances. The communications consist of verbal communications or text messages transmitted through the phone. Further, it is common that persons who use cellular phones store the name and number of the persons they communicate with as electronic data in the form of names and phone numbers. Further, many phones are designed to store a record of recently called numbers, recently transmitted text messages, and to electronically store video and photos. Further, some cellular phone users assign photos, songs, or lyrics to frequent callers to identify the caller when a communication is received.


